Feature Highlight: Courses@Dartmouth is Live

The Arts & Sciences Registrar's Office, in partnership with ITC, is pleased to announce that [Courses@Dartmouth](#) is live! Students are using the system for the spring term Add/Drop period, which continues until April 12th. For the upcoming summer and fall term course elections, refer to the registration schedules on the Registrar's website to see when the Primary Carts will become available. Please note that the cart will be available prior to course election, but students will not be able to submit their carts until the election period begins.

Sophomore Major Declaration:

Students in the class of 2028 may officially declare a major in DartHub. This exciting milestone in their academic career provides several benefits once their major is declared, such as course priority during course election, faculty advisors, and the ability to use the D-Plan petition to change their enrollment pattern.

Students who have declared their major can use DartWorks Degree Audit to monitor their progress towards graduation. Most majors and a growing list of minors are supported in the Degree Audit. For more details, refer to the [DartWorks guide](#).
